It has won numerous awards since its establishment, including the "Best Exhibition and Convention Centre in Asia".

The KLCC is surrounded by major international hotels – the Mandarin Oriental, the Traders Hotel, the Grand Hyatt, the Novotel, the Prince, the Shangri-La, the JW Marriot and the Westin.

THE EXHIBITION & CAREER TALKS
